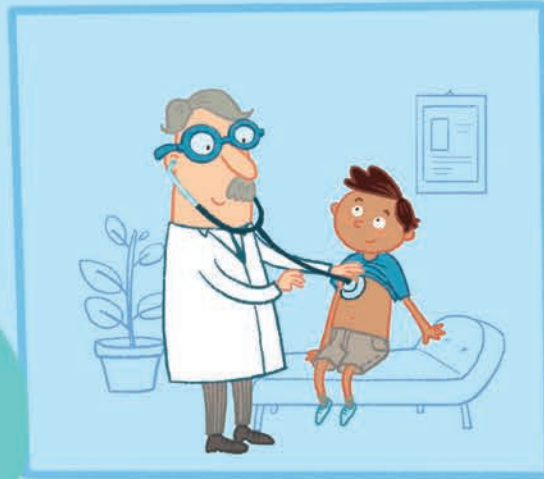


Jack and Sarah have got anemia.

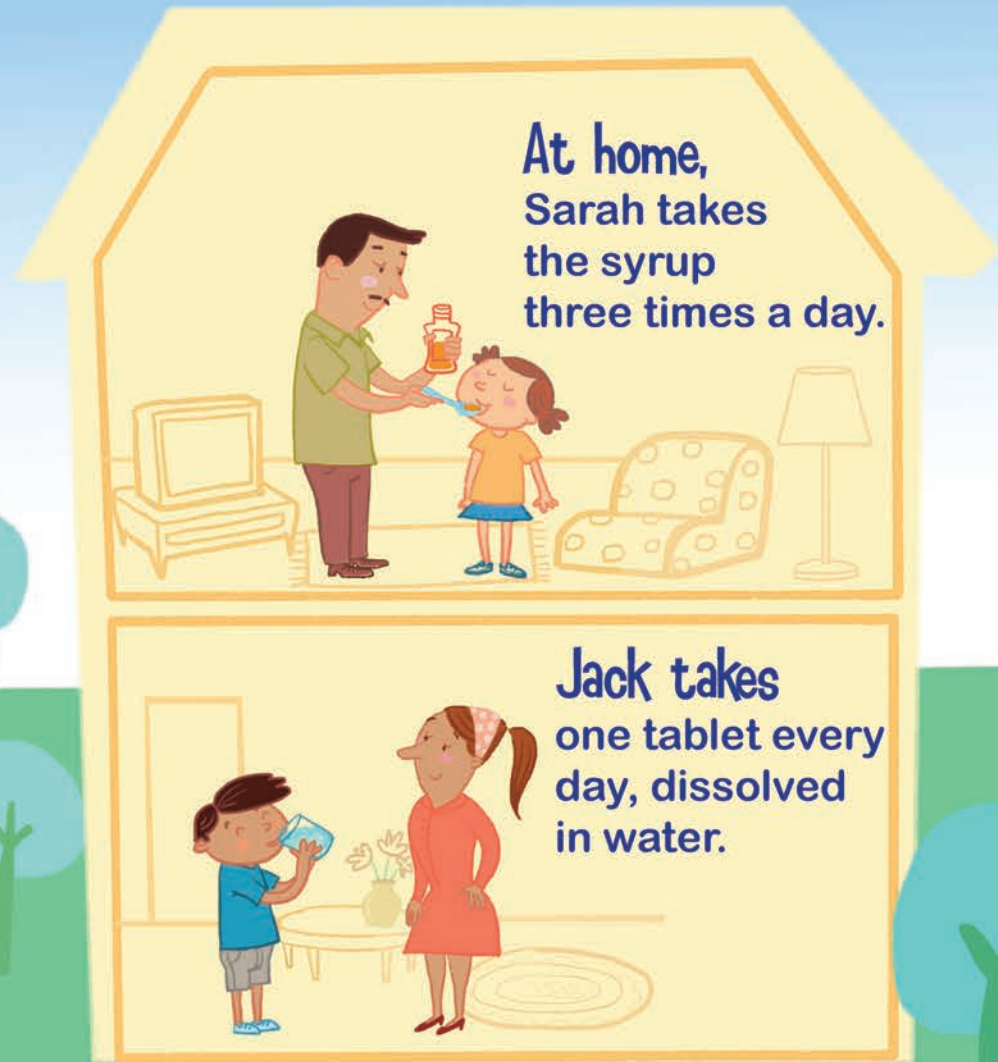
This year they want to find out whether Doctor Ironless's new syrup works as well as the tablets do.
